#### Interrupted actions

To describe an action that was interrupted by another action. For example, "She was sleeping when the alarm sounded".

### Simultaneous actions

To describe two actions that were happening at the same time. For example, "I was running while he was jogging".

# **Habitual actions**

To indicate that something was habitual. For example, "My mom and dad were always arguing".
