Do you know anything about the Malvinas Islands?

For Argentina, the Malvinas Islands are Argentine territory. This means Argentina thinks these islands **belong** to them. People in Argentina call them "Las Malvinas Argentinas."

Argentina says the Malvinas Islands are theirs because of history. Spanish people come to the islands a long, long time ago. Argentina becomes an **independent country** in 1810, and it says the islands are part of its land.

But in 1833, another country, Great Britain, **takes control** of the islands. This is a sad moment for Argentina. Since then, Argentina always asks Great Britain to talk about the islands and give them back.

In 1982, there is a **war** between Argentina and Great Britain about the islands. This is a difficult time. Many Argentine soldiers fight **bravely**. Great Britain wins the war, and they still **control** the islands today.

Even though Great Britain controls them, the Malvinas Islands are still very important for Argentina. They are a **symbol** of **national pride** and a **reminder** of Argentina's history. Every year, on April 2nd, Argentina remembers the soldiers and the Malvinas Islands. It's a day to remember the history and hope for a peaceful future where the islands return to Argentina.
