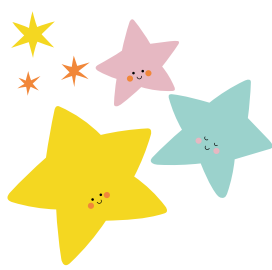

Indefinite Pronouns



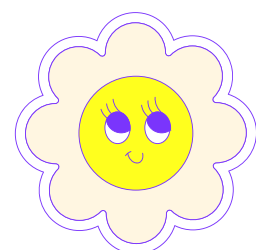
Indefinite pronouns refer to non-specific persons, things, or places. They are used when the speaker or writer does not need to specify the identity of the subject or object.

Person	Thing	Place
Somebody	Something	Somewhere
Anybody	Anything	Anywhere
Nobody	Everything	Everywhere
Everybody	Nothing	Somewhere
Someone	Everything	Nowhere
Anyone		Somewhere
No one		Nowhere
Everyone
