Add -er to the end of most one-syllable adjectives to form the comparative.* If the adjective ends in -e, add -r.

Use more before most long adjectives (adjectives that have two or more syllables)

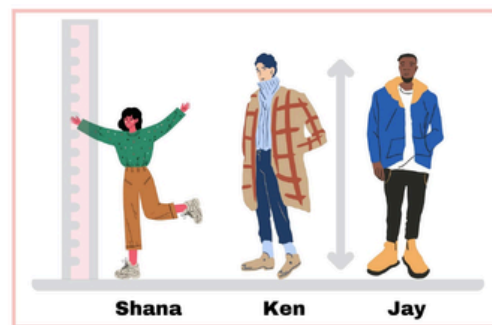

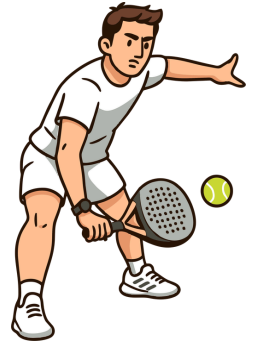
